Dr Jaclyn Broadbent is Associate Head of School (Teaching and Learning) in the School of Psychology and a Research Fellow at the Centre for Research in Assessment and Digital Learning at Deakin University. Jaclyn runs the School of Psychology's largest unit 'Health Behaviour', teaching more than 2000 Faculty of Health students each year the skills and principles of behaviour modification.

Jaclyn is passionate about providing high-quality, authentic learning experiences that engage and retain students and support them through their learning journey. Her interest is in developing innovative, cost-effective solutions for challenges associated with the experience of first-year students, online study, and teaching large classes.

Alongside her high teaching load, in the past five years Jaclyn has produced 31 published or accepted papers. Her research focuses on development, evaluation, and translation of effective teaching strategies for student success. This research includes the role of self-regulation in the learning process; use of feedback and online technologies to ensure positive student outcomes; and determinants of student success, engagement, and retention.

Jaclyn has won several prestigious teaching awards, including an Australian Award for University Teaching (2016), Deakin University Teacher of the Year (2016), Desire2Learn Teaching Impact award (2014), citation from the Office of Learning and Teaching for Outstanding Contributions to Student Learning (2012). Jaclyn was recently chosen for the year-long Joan Kirner Young and Emerging Women Leaders program (2017-2018).
